Thanks to generous donors and a grant from the Lowell Johnson Foundation, our work continues, and we are on track to exceed our 2021 numbers, with 89 large layettes and 180 mini layettes delivered so far in 2022 (as of May 6). ## Bereavement Suite at Genesis East

Serving the Bereavement Suite and honoring the unborn and their parents, is a privilege. Since we began this project last fall CCS has blessed these families with baby items such as 9" square blankets and carefully crocheted baby hats, toiletries for mom and baby, and grief materials /books for parents and families. The staff at the birth center is very appreciative they can support those experiencing a difficult loss through the items CCS provides.

CCS members are now making white prayer shawls for moms, an item never given before. Each shawl has a tag which says we are praying for them and a verse from Psalm 139:13, "For you created my inmost being: you knit me together in my mother's womb."
